What is Title I?

M. D. Roberts Middle is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA). achievement including strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written plan.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how M. D. Roberts Middle will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. M. D. Roberts Middle values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that M. D. Roberts Middle will support parent engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

M. D. Roberts Middle invited all parents to attend our annual revision meetings last spring to review and revise this Parent and Family Engagement plan, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact and the parent and family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an input and feedback meeting form. The form is posted on our school website for parents to review and submit feedback throughout the year. Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. M. D. Roberts Middle will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, families in transition, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will mail the plan to all parents in August before the scheduled Open House event. The plan will also be posted on the school Web site. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center and front office at M. D. Roberts Middle.

2018–19 District Goals

By 2023, Clayton County Public Schools will increase the percentage of students scoring at the proficient and/or distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones to at least 80% in each content area.

Over the next five years, Clayton County Public Schools will increase the graduation rate from 69.6% to 90% or higher.

2018–19 School Goals

On the 2017 GMAS report, increase the student performance indicator in Reading and Mathematics by 3%. The focus for is:

- 6th grade- Geometry, Statistics & Probability, Literary Comprehension
- 7th grade- Numbers & Operations, Ratio and Proportional Relationships, Literary Comprehension
- 8th grade- Algebra & Functions, Geometry & Writing Process


